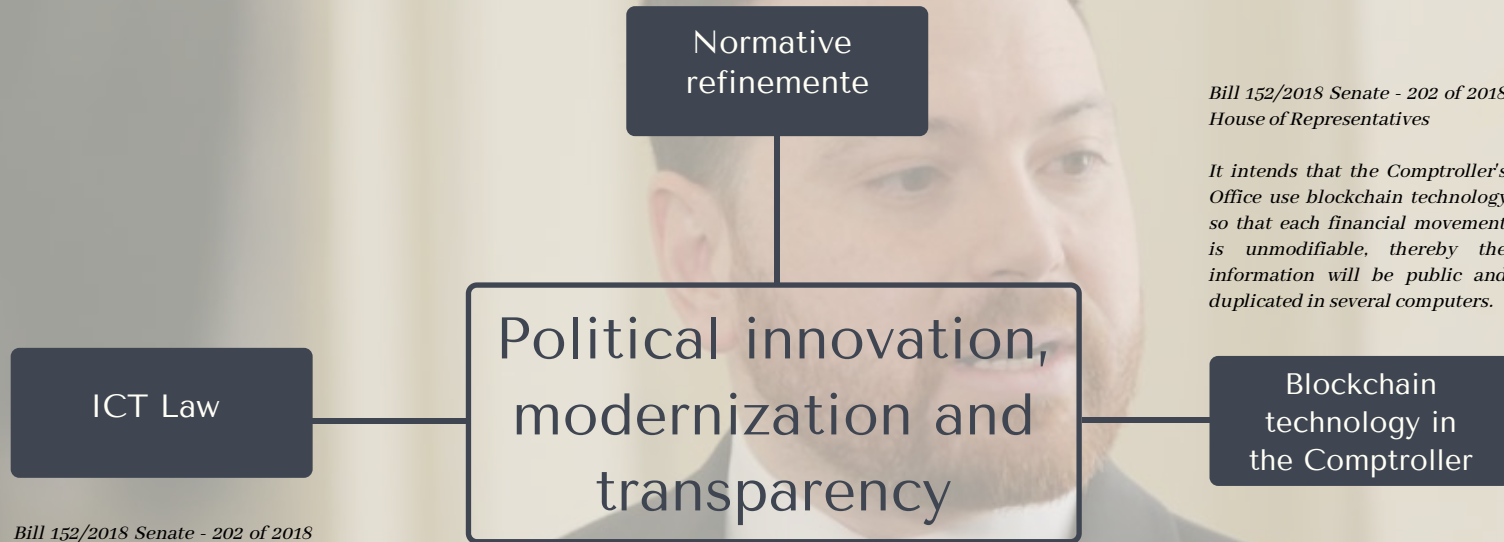

ADDITIONAL INITIATIVES

Bill 169/2018 House of Representatives 199/2018 Senate

Repeal more than 11 thousand obsolete laws that have been identified as deposable. The great benefit of the initiative is the MODERNIZATION of legislation



Bill 152/2018 Senate - 202 of 2018 House of Representatives

It intends that the Comptroller's Office use blockchain technology so that each financial movement is unmodifiable, thereby the information will be public and duplicated in several computers.

Bill 152/2018 Senate - 202 of 2018 House of Representatives

It seeks to modernize ICT regulation, open the door to new technologies and allow the sector growth. García Zuccardi has led the theme since 2014

Digital and remote voting

Bill 18/2018 Senate

Its objective is that, in addition to physically voting, Colombians have the opportunity to vote digitally and remotely throughout the national territory. The proposal seeks to reduce electoral fraud, abstention and costs

Fight against corruption and violence through inclusion and financial education

Bill 109/2018 Senate

It seeks to promote education, protection, inclusion, non-discrimination and greater transparency for users of the financial sector



EMPLOYMENT, EMPLOYABILITY AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

1. Legal capacity of adults with disabilities

Bill 27/2017 House of Representatives, 256/2019 Senate

The bill gives back legal capacity to people with disabilities so they can decide about their life and can access to formal jobs with all working conditions.

2. Law of Regions RAP (Administrative and Planning Region)

Bill 258/2018 House of Representatives 182/2017 Senate

The initiative known as the Regions Act passed its four debates and conciliations in Congress and seeks to strengthen the Administrative and Planning Regions, giving them resources and participation. This translates into more and better employment opportunities, employability and entrepreneurship

3. Dyslexia Law

Bill 108/2018 Senate

It aims to guarantee the right to inclusive education for people with Dyslexia, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder - ADHD - and other learning difficulties (AD), at all levels of the education system. In this manner, better employability opportunities are promoted for all Colombians

4. Incentives for companies that hire adults over 40

Bill Senate: 240/18. Camera: 047/17

The initiative seeks to include men over 50 and women over 40 (young adults), in article 11 of Law 1429 of 2010 (Employment Generation Law) to facilitate them the insertion and reintegration into the labor market

5. Benefits for workers in educational institutions that are difficult to access

Bill 135 of 2018,

Through this initiative, benefits will be offered to workers in the administrative area in the education sector, who are providing their services in rural areas that are difficult to access.

6. Benefits for people in charge of the terminally ill and people with disabilities

Bill 137/18 Senate "

Subsidies are granted to people in charge of the terminally ill and disabled who need permanent care

7. Nationality for Venezuelan children

Bill 252/2019 Senate

The proposal seeks that children of Venezuelan parents who are in the country, as a result of the exodus, can receive Colombian nationality by adoption

8. Greater incentives for entrepreneurs

Bill 149 of 2018 Senate

Modifies Law 1429 of 2010. It extends the age range of the beneficiaries of the law. Extensive technical and financial support (beneficiaries in both rural and urban areas). Create more incentives for entrepreneurs

9. Incentives for companies within Orange economy

Bill 203/2018 House of Representatives

Tax incentives are created for companies specialized in the development of information technologies, those dedicated to the creative industries

10. Nationality for Venezuelans

Bill 230 of 2019 Senate

The initiative seeks to give the opportunity to Venezuelans, victims of the crisis of the sister country, to be adopted by Colombia and acquire nationality so that they can access formal jobs and fulfill the duties of any Colombian

The idea is that together with the groups of cyclists, citizens and actors related to the sector, public entities and congressmen, a common agenda is created on the current state of the bicycle in Colombia, its main challenges and how to overcome them

The initiative aims to preserve the life and health of all inhabitants of the national territory against the risks posed by exposure to asbestos and substances recognized scientifically as harmful to public health, collective and individual.

The Bill seeks to create better conditions for cyclists throughout the national territory. The initiative led by the Irma Herrera, Representative to the House of the Mira Party and other congressmen, also seeks to honor all cyclists who have died or been victims of crimes

ADDITIONAL INITIATIVES

National budget

Bill 254/2018 Senate - 231/2018 House of Representatives

The Caribbean Congressional Committee managed to increase the resources allocated to the departments of the region in the National Budget proposal with respect to the 2018 Budget. In addition, García Zuccardi obtained resources for the salary leveling of public officials

Paralimpic Committee

Bill 147 of 2017 House of Representatives, 207/2018 Senate

Member of the Congressional Inclusive Committee and co-author of the bill that creates the Paralympic Sport Committee, and which will guarantee that Colombian athletes can compete at an international level. The bill passed its fourth debate in Congress.

Interparty Alliance on a new drug policy

Congressmen from eight different parties came together to form an alliance for the reform of drug policy.
